Bundled branches will be picked up **SIX TIMES** in 2024 beginning the **FIRST MONDAY** of **MAY** and continuing through **October**. The start dates and the rules are listed to the right. You may want to save this list so you can time your trimming to our pick-up dates.

Have your tied up bundles at curbside or roadside by 6:30 a.m. on those Monday mornings. Our crew is on a rotating street schedule and it may take

them 3 to 5 days to complete the branch collection. They will visit each area and street only once.

Branches must be tied up in bundles. We will leave a "red tag" explanation if we don't pick up your branches.

- START DATES**
- MAY 6 (MONDAY)
 - JUNE 3 (MONDAY)
 - JULY 1 (MONDAY)
 - AUGUST 5 (MONDAY)
 - SEPTEMBER 3 (TUESDAY)
 - OCTOBER 7 (MONDAY)

FOLLOW THESE RULES:

- ◇ Branches cut to 4 feet
- ◇ Branch diameter 4 inches or less
- ◇ Bundles must be tied with twine or string (no wire or plastic)
- ◇ Bundles up to 25 lbs. only

Our program is intended to help homeowners with the disposal of tree and shrub branches that do not qualify as yard waste. If it fits in a yard waste bag it should not be in the roadside bundle. Our collection service is not meant to remove whole trees.

Please make other arrangements for removal when a tree is cut down.

Please don't put your branch bundles in the street. Place them in the parkway closest to the curb or the edge of the road. Also, we may not be able to pick them up if a parked

car is in the way.

This Road District service is offered only to residences along the roads that we maintain in unincorporated Lisle Township.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER BY: ED YOUNG

Wow! We only received around 50% of our normal snowfall and the temperatures were quite mild as well. Rather than plowing, the crew did tree trimming and removal, patching and maintenance. There is always a great need for maintenance, the equipment takes quite a beating just in normal use.

The tree stock in the unincorporated Lisle is aging. While the normal life span of a particular species may be considered much longer, the environment of the parkway trees is not suitable to longevity. Salt, drought, and lack of mulch all shorten the trees' life expectancy remarkably. Recent communications from a certified arborist suggested that it was past time to

plan a replacement strategy rather than continue maintenance. Tree removal could have a dramatic effect on sound level and your view at your home. We need to be thinking about replacements.

Ivanhoe Ave. recently reopened after a house explosion on July 1, 2023. No traffic changes to the street have occurred yet but I am committed to finding solutions to the amount and speed of traffic on Ivanhoe.

There continues to be strife among the Trustees and Supervisor. Spending on professional services (accountants, lawyers and consultants) has skyrocketed. New services have been added without

proper need or financial analysis. I urge you to attend or watch on YouTube the Trustee meetings and let your elected officials know how you feel.

Staff is doing well. We have had our share of COVID et al. But no long-term ill effects. I am grateful to have competent staff who always have the best interest of Lisle Township in their efforts. If you have any questions or concerns feel free to give us a call. In closing If you ever see any unsafe road conditions contact the Sheriff immediately. The Sheriff will then contact us.

Sidewalk Squares Replacement Program

Deadline Monday, July 8th

To help homeowners replace cracked, raised or sunken sidewalks, Lisle Township Road District will pick up more than half the cost when we replace. Call 630-964-0057 or email:

highway@lisletownship.com by July 8th to be put on the sidewalk replacement list.

Your special cost will be \$1.25 per square foot which is \$31.25 for the typical 5' x 5' section. Mark the squares you wish to replace with a dot of white

paint. Our superintendent will leave an invoice-agreement form after he measures. Return the form with payment in full. The work usually begins in August.

ROAD MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE FOR 2024

ASPHALT



THE township roads being resurfaced this season are listed below. Approximately 2 inches of surface

is removed and replaced with new asphalt.

Naperville NW:

Project start dates have not yet been determined.

FLYERS will be distributed to the homes along these streets about 5 days before construction begins. They will explain the repair process and outline any driving and parking restrictions.

RECLAMITE

We apply surface treatments to preserve and restore other township roads.

Reclamite is a sealant used on one year old roads and is reapplied every 4 years. The following roads are scheduled:

Hobson Creek: Spyglass Ct., Moraine Ct., Country Ct., Woodcrest Ct. E & W., Creek Ct., Wedgewood Ct.

Steeple Chase: Ohio St., Meadows: Crest Ln.

Plank Rd. Area: Radcliff Rd. (So. Of Plank)

Steeple Run: Springdale Dr., Starling Ct., Cardinal Ct.

Our reclamite contractor will seal one side of the street at a time, so at least one lane is open for resident traffic. The sealants need up to four hours of drying time before the lane is opened.

CRACK-FILL

Crack-filling seals cracks too big for the other products to repair. Contractors clean out the cracks then fill them.

Residents living on streets where this work will be done will be notified by flyer before the

work starts.

Our goal is to provide safe, durable and attractive roads and right-of-ways, while minimizing inconvenience to residents.



CONCRETE

Each season, some curbing is scheduled for replacement. **If** curbing is to be replaced through your driveway, a **pink dot** will be spray painted there to indicate so. You will be given ample notice, via flyer, to move your car out of the driveway. The driveway will not be accessible for approximately 5-7 days. We apologize for any inconvenience.
